

Pikachu (keychain) amigurumi

Body

Start with: 7 st in a loop

Row 1 [13 st]: inc, 1, inc, inc, inc, inc, inc

Row 2 [19 st]: 1, inc, 2, inc, 1, inc, 1, inc, 1, inc, 1, inc

Row 3 [25 st]: 2, inc, 3, inc, 2, inc, 2, inc, 2, inc, 2, inc

Row 4 [26 st]: 15, inc, 9

Row 5 [28 st]: 8, inc, 12, inc, 4

Row 6 [29 st]: 7, inc, 20

Row 7 [31 st]: 1, inc, 13, inc, 13

Row 8 [32 st]: 30, inc

Row 9 [34 st]: 7, inc, 15, inc, 8

Row 10 [35 st]: 24, inc, 9

Row 11 [29 st]: 2, dec, 4, dec, 4, dec, 4, dec, 4, dec, 3, dec, 2
Row 12 [22 st]: dec, 2, dec, 2, dec, 3, dec, 2, dec, 2, dec, 2, dec, 2

Row 13 [15 st]: 1, dec, 1, dec, 1, dec, 1, dec, 2, dec, 1, dec, 1, dec

Row 14 [9 st]: 1, dec, dec, 1, dec, dec, 1, dec, dec

Fill with fiber

Row 15 [6 st]: 1, dec, 1, dec, 1 dec

Row 15 [3 st]: dec, dec, dec, sl. st.

Fasten off, close

Make a zigzag pattern in brown or black on the back like this:

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Sew a mouth with black like this:

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Make the eyes and cheeks with felt, pins, paint or whatever you want.

Ears (make 2)

Start with: 5 st in a loop (black)

Row 1 [8 st]: inc, 1, inc, 1, inc

Row 2 [9 st]: 4, inc, 3, inc

Row 3 [11 st]: 2, inc, 3, inc, 2, sl.st.

Fasten off, make slip knot with yellow (or change colour the way you are used to do it)

Row 4 [12 st]: 1, inc, 9, sl.st

Row 5 [7 st]: dec, dec, 1, dec, dec, 1, dec

Row 6 [7 st]: sc around

Row 7 [5 st]: dec, 2, dec, 1, sl. st.

Fasten off, leave tail. Fill with fiber.

Tail

Start with brown or black

Crochet in rows, not in circles

Chain 5

****Start sc in second chain from the hook, sc all**

Chain 1, turn work around, sc all

Chain 1, turn work around, sc all minus 2 stitches (so leave the last two stitches)

Change colour (yellow)

Chain 1, turn work around, sc to the end and then chain 4.******

Do **** [..] **** twice more, but without the colour change.

Chain 1, turn work around

Sc 2, sl.st. twice

Fasten off, weave in end to make the tail more rigid.

Use the brown/black yarn at the start to sew on to body, leaving one row of stitches between the tail and the zigzag pattern on its back.

The first yellow tip that touches its back can be sewn on with yellow yarn just above the zigzag pattern on its back.

Now the tail should be stable. If it curls up, this means you made the stitches too tight. If it is rigid enough, but the top keeps falling over, you can choose to also attach the second yellow tip that touches its back, just as you did with the first yellow tip.
